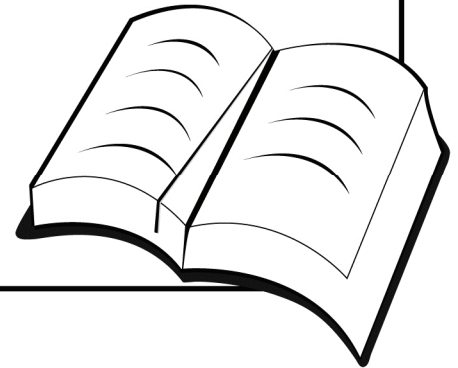

READY TO SHARE: God's Abundance, GCPC, and the Exhortations of 1 Timothy 6:17-19

Good News For Persons Over The Age Of 70 ½

Last December Congress re-enacted legislation allowing qualified charitable IRA donations. **Under the Tax Relief, Unemployment Insurance Reauthorization and Job Creation Act of 2010, any donor age 70 ½ or older may contribute up to \$100,000 from an IRA account and avoid federal tax consequences.**

The charitable gift amount can count against the donor's required minimum distribution (RMD).

When the amount withdrawn from the IRA account is paid directly to the charity by the IRA administrator, it is not counted as federally taxable income. However, because the gift is excluded from income, it may not be included as a charitable deduction on a federal tax return. These rules apply to gifts made through December 31, 2011.

Now is the time to act if you are contemplating making a major gift to the Grace Covenant Foundation or contributing to the church operating or building funds. **Prepaying your 2012 pledge is another way this law can be of benefit.** Your tax advisor should be consulted before electing an IRA distribution.
