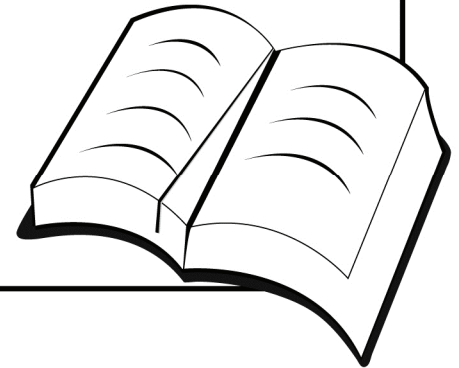

AN OPEN CONVERSATION: Table Talks Focus on GCPC's Future

The time has come! Beginning Wednesday, October 19th, we will have our first group conversation about the future we envision for Grace Covenant. On four consecutive Wednesdays, four different groups of church members will gather to discuss where we believe God is leading us.

These conversations will inform both our Pastor Nominating Committee and, eventually, the pastors who are discerning whether God is calling them to apply to be our next Pastor/Head of Staff. Typically, each night will include a meal along with our conversation. The entire evening will run from 6:00-7:15.

The basis for our conversation will be the questions (page 2) listed in this newsletter. Take a moment to read through and prayerfully consider how you might answer them prior to coming to your night. You have been assigned a night based on where you fall in the alphabet. This unscientific means of dividing the congregation is designed to do two things: (1) provide a manageable number for our discussion each night; (2) gather together a cross-section of our membership to insure that people from different areas of the life of our church contribute to the conversation and hear one another. That said, you should not feel "bound" by your place in the alphabet. We want you to come to one of the nights, and if you are more likely to come if you can attend with a friend or family member, or if you have a conflict on the night you were assigned, by all means, come on one of the other nights! We believe the best way for us to collectively discern God's will for our church is to have as great a representation of our membership as possible. Here is the schedule, A through Z!

October 26th: Edmiston through Lunn

November 2nd: Lyons through Rutherford

November 9th: Salisbury through Zella

Please mark down the night you are encouraged to attend and plan to be there. Following our conversations, our next step—with the approval of the presbytery's Committee on Ministry—will be to elect our Pastor Nominating Committee, have our mission study, prepare our Church Information Form, and then begin searching. May God bless us in our work together.

INTERIM QUESTIONS



The interim period gives us a wonderful opportunity to take a step back and think about who we are and where we see God leading us. Having an open conversation along these lines will be an invaluable resource for our Pastor Nominating Committee as we move toward a Mission Study and begin to search for our next pastor. The goal, of course, is to find the pastor who is a perfect fit for GCPC, and being able to articulate what kind of church we are and who we would like to be is essential for such discernment.

1. What do you find unique about Grace Covenant? What is our “calling card” as a church that makes us distinct from other churches (particularly other Presbyterian churches)?
2. Who is our neighbor? (i.e., how would you describe our neighborhood, what kind of person finds a connection at GCPC, to whom do you think we are called to reach out).
3. Why would someone join Grace Covenant? How would you describe our “ideal member?”
4. What is appealing to GCPC theologically? Are their particular issues of faith that we find especially engaging? How does that find expression in worship?
5. What kind of role have pastors played here (both senior pastor and associates)? Which aspects of previous pastors would you say we “can’t do without?” Are their skills that have not been as strongly represented that you would like to see in the future?
6. How would you describe us as a church (age of members, level of education, socio-economics, environment)?
7. What do you see as primary areas of growth and challenge for the next few years? Specifically, if you were to imagine how we could develop a vision coming out of our recent building campaign, what would that look like?

Bring your own supplies and crop Friday Night. Leave your stuff where it is and come back all day Saturday to crop till you drop.

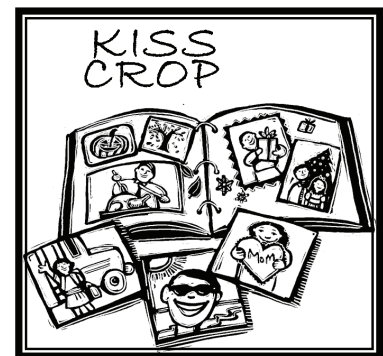

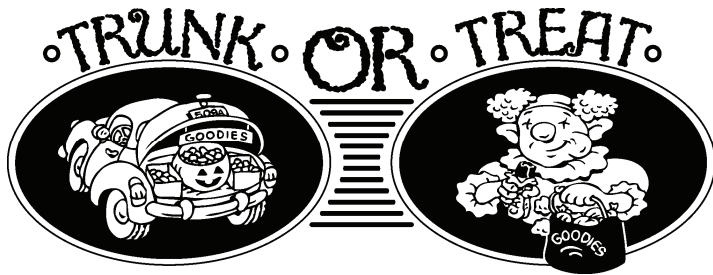

A recipe from...

MAKES 2 LARGE LOAVES

SET OVEN TO 325

¼ C oleo

3-1/2 C flour

1-1/3 C sugar

2-1/4 t baking soda

3 eggs

1 t salt

1 C diced whole orange (med)

2 C sour or buttermilk

2 C raisins

~ EILEEN SILVERS ~

ORANGE BREAD

Cream oleo and sugar in large bowl for 5 mins. Beat eggs in at high speed. Grind orange in blender or food processor (can blend with milk). Coat raisins with some of the flour and set aside. Mix dry ingredients and set aside. Blend orange into creamed mixture alternately with dry ingredients and mix for 2 mins. Fold raisins into mixture and pour into 2 loaf pans (1 loaf pan = 3 small loaf pans). Bake for one hour. Use toothpick test.

Glaze:

1 C OJ

1 C sugar

Cook for five minutes and pour over breads after baking.

Freezes well.

It originated in Spain after that country's civil war, when the church there needed a revival. We retain the Spanish nomenclature to honor Cursillo's history.

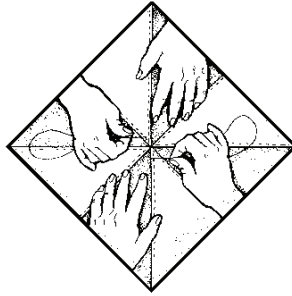

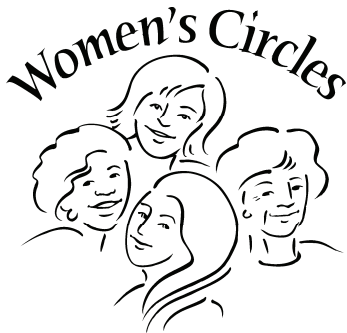
Somebody stole my church and I want it back!!!

Music Notes

One of the favorite Psalms for a musician is Psalm 150.

**“Praise him with fanfares of the trumpet,
Praise him on lute and harp,
Praise him with tambourines and dancing,
Praise him with flute and strings,”**

I always want to add, Praise Him with a joyful voice!

Count the many ways we praise God in our services.

Through staff meetings, we are working to coordinate scripture and songs throughout the church season. You will find changes in the service, to keep you on your toes? To keep you spiritually involved.

October 2 is **Worldwide Communion Sunday**. Christians throughout the world celebrate communion. This is a wonderful way to celebrate the cultural diversity of the Christian Faith. On this Sunday, we will praise God with xylophones, drums and other world instruments and music. Our Anthem will be music of South Africa, sung in Bantu and English. One of the hymns will be a favorite that is sung with a joyful calypso flavor.

We will sing an early traditional Spiritual.

You will also notice that our benediction response is an Argentine folk melody.

The benediction response can be found in the hymnal. It is Hymn# 432. “Song of Hope”. We use the refrain, sung in English, for the response. The text appears on the screens, and the congregation is encouraged to join the choir as you become more familiar with the melody. It’s an easy tune, and the text is a good mission statement for all Christians.

The choir always knows when you really like an anthem. A great way to let us know is to show your appreciation after the service. We sing to worship God, not to entertain. While applause is a way many people like to show appreciation, it would be better to have a good “Amen”. Let’s keep our focus on God and praising him with beautiful, spiritual singing.
